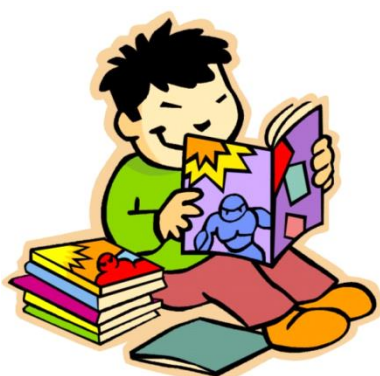


## Blaby Stokes CE Y5/6 Recommended Reads
